Homework

Year 3 students will continue to bring their homework to school for teacher sighting on Thursday mornings and begin the next week's homework activities on a Friday. Term 3 Homework tasks include: Reading, Excel English Book, Maths Mentals and Spelling.

As always, we encourage you to support your child to work to their full potential and present quality work. For students to gain the maximum potential from homework, please:

- Ensure all **homework** is completed promptly, neatly and returned on time. This will enable you and your child to work out an **appropriate schedule** that does not encourage them to leave work until the last minute.
- Ensure sufficient time and space is given to support your child to complete homework.
- Review and mark the work together.
- Ensure your child's out of school schedule allows them to focus on homework and places an emphasis on the academic needs of your child.

Encourage your child to <u>read aloud every night</u>.

We ask all parents to continue to monitor the completion of homework. Please sign the Reading Log book and student homework book on a weekly basis.

Key Learning Areas

English: The focus of writing this term is learning to entertain, with Year 3 focusing on narratives, guided by the book Fantastic Mr Fox. Grammar and vocabulary are explicitly taught as part of the entertaining writing unit of work. During reading group sessions, students will engage in analysing and comprehending a range of text types. Students will participate in daily spelling lessons investigating the orthographic, morphological and phonological components of words. Year 3 students will also continue lessons this term focused on developing their handwriting skills.

<u>Mathematics</u>: Students will further develop their knowledge, skills and strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division in a variety of contexts including regular Number Talks. They will learn to represent money values in multiple ways and count the change required for simple transactions to the nearest five cents. Students will further their skills in various areas of mathematics including addition & subtraction, patterns & algebra, mass, 3D space, volume & capacity and whole number.

<u>Geography:</u> Continuing on from Term 3, students examine the diverse characteristics of Australia's neighbouring countries, specifically the Pacific Islands and New Zealand. Students will engage in a research project where they display key information as a group about their chosen neighbouring country. These projects will be shared with the Year 3 cohort and the school community towards the end of Term 4.

<u>Science:</u> Following on from last term, students will explore how contact and non-contact forces can cause changes in an object's motion. Students will be given a design challenge in teams using Ozobots. Students will learn how to code and demonstrate their understanding of forces by designing and building a transportation device that can be connected to the Ozobot.

<u>Personal Development/Health/Physical Education (PDHPE):</u> In Personal Development & Health lessons, Year 3 students will develop protective skills & strategies that can be utilised in a range of environments. They will learn strategies that promote personal safety and begin to recognise how to identify unsafe situations. In Physical Education lessons, students will apply the skills and movements that they developed last term as they participate in games of modified netball.

<u>Creative Arts:</u> This term students will learn about the elements of drama. They will practise identifying the elements and responding to a range of drama clips. They will work collaboratively to make movement phrases and skits using different forms and perform these in front of audiences.

Assessment & Reporting

Classroom assessment is continuous and the first few weeks of this term are allocated to the analysis of data in preparation for Semester 2 reports. When preparing these reports we take into consideration class bookwork and participation, anecdotal records, homework, projects and tests to allocate grades representing your child's actual achievement in each learning area. Across grade assessments are an integral and effective tool for making comparisons between students in different classes. This enables teachers to plan and modify teaching programs to meet individual learning needs.

Semester Two Reports will come out at the end of Term 4. It is a comprehensive report outlining student achievement in all 6 KLAs and specialist programs at Randwick Public School.

Please continue to assist us by:
