- Keeps toys and other valuable items at home.
- Has up to date personal and health information, including any medical details, kept at the office.

If you have an urgent message that needs to be shared with your class teacher or your child (e.g. change of afternoon pick up arrangements, please call the school office and they will relay the message to the classroom teacher in a timely manner.

Birthdays

We love celebrating birthdays in class. If you wish to send in something to celebrate your child's birthdays please send something individually packaged such as ice blocks from the school canteen. These can be pre-ordered via Flexischools. Otherwise individual cupcakes are a good choice.

Homework

The purpose of homework at RPS is to provide consolidation of learning and support for students in planning and organising time as well as establishing habits of study, concentration and self discipline

Students will be expected to complete a **maximum of 40 minutes** of homework a day. Part of this homework will be home reading as well as completing a 'Maths Plus' unit of work. Optional activities will include Reading Eggspress and Matharoo Supplementary homework **may** be sent home by specialists and support teachers throughout the week. Occasionally students may be given additional projects to complete. Please mark your child's homework as they complete it as instant feedback is one of the keys to successful learning.

Homework will be issued on a **Friday** to be returned on **Thursday** the following week. This will allow students to use the weekend to complete homework if they wish. We are realistic about homework and understand 'life' gets in the way. However, we would appreciate your support in encouraging your child to complete their weekly homework tasks. This is important when instilling good organisational skills and independent work habits.

Key Learning Areas

The six key learning areas in primary school are: English, Mathematics, History and Geography (HSIE), Science/STEM, Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE) and Creative Arts.

English 3-6

In Term 2 students will continue to gain an understanding of the concept of 'genre' and the supporting concept of 'perspective and context' through a deep analysis of the texts Deadly Science – The Solar System: Book 5 and Meanwhile Back on Earth. Throughout the unit, students will understand that genre refers to texts that are grouped according to purpose, subject matter, form, structure and language choices. Students will plan, create and revise texts considering perspective and context and informative purposes. Later on in the term, students will study the text Ned Kelly and the Green Sash. Throughout the unit students will develop a deeper understanding of rhetorical devices used to strengthen an argument to persuade an audience. Students will apply this knowledge when creating responses and written texts.

Mathematics 3-6

In the Maths curriculum, students will develop essential numeracy knowledge and skills and develop an understanding of concepts on Number and Algebra, Measurement and Space and Statistics and Probability. Students will develop understanding of and fluency in mathematics through exploring and connecting mathematical concepts, choosing and applying mathematical techniques to solve problems to communicate their thinking and reasoning both coherently and clearly.

History

Students will continue their study of the topic *First Contacts*. Students will examine European exploration and colonisation in Australia and throughout the world up to the early 1880s. Students will examine the impact of exploration on other societies, how these societies interacted with newcomers and how these experiences contributed to their cultural diversity.

Science & Technology

Students will continue their study of the topic *Living World*. Students will focus on learning about classification, life cycles and the survival of living things. Students will consider the agricultural processes used to grow plants and raise animals. Students will design and produce a product or system to support the growth of a plant and/or animals.

Creative Arts

Students will have their creative art lessons combined with their Italian or Mandarin language lessons this term. During these lessons they will focus on drama, using gestures, movement and voice to take on roles and explore characterisation in everyday and imagined situations. They will also view and share their opinions on the performances of others.

PD/H/PE

Physical Education class sport sessions will focus on basketball skills, including passing, throwing, dribbling, footwork, defending, attacking, intercepting, shooting, rebounding and teamwork. Students are encouraged to wear sports shoes during these sessions. Students will also continue to participate in PSSA sport or School Sport each Friday afternoon.

In Personal, Health and Development students will study the child protection unit Standing Up For The Rights Of Myself and Others. Students will learn about the changes that happen during puberty. Students will investigate whether the rights of others are being respected in given scenarios and use this information to identify behaviours that constitute various types of abuse. Students will discuss and identify protective strategies that can be used to support and keep themselves and others safe with a focus on upstander behaviour.

Assembly will be held on a Tuesday this term (2:25 - 3pm) during Week 3, 5 and 7. Parents and carers will be invited in to attend the assembly on the week their child's class is hosting and/or if their child is receiving an award.
